

Holy Michael, the Archangel, defend us in the day of battle.
Be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil.
May God rebuke him, we humbly pray
and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host,
by the Power of God thrust down into hell,
Satan and all the other wicked spirits
who wander through the world seeking the ruin of souls.

Over the years the Church has been blessed with many great Saints whose lives were remarkable. Some of these Saints had great devotion to the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Many of these Saints were either children or young people. Here are only a few:

Imelda Lambertini (1322 – May 12, 1333) is the patroness of First Communicants. At the age of nine she went to live with the Dominican Sisters near Bologna. At this point she had not yet received her First Holy Communion. On May 12, 1333, the day of the vigil of the Ascension, she knelt in prayer and the "Light of the Host" was reportedly witnessed above her head by the Sacristan, who then fetched the priest so he could see. After seeing this miracle, the priest felt compelled to admit her to receiving the Eucharist. Immediately after receiving it, Lambertini went back to her seat, and decided to stay after mass and pray. Later when a nun came to get Lambertini for supper, she found Lambertini still kneeling with a smile on her face. The nun called her name, but she did not stir, so she lightly tapped Imelda on the shoulder, at which Imelda collapsed to the floor dead. Her remains are kept in Bologna at the Church of San Sigismondo. She was declared Blessed by Pope Leo XIII in 1826.

St Francisco Marto of Fatima (19th June 1908– 4th April 1919) Feast Day 20th February After the Apparitions of Our Lady that he experienced with his sister (St) Jacinta and their cousin (Servant of God) Sr Lucia, his spirituality grew with great devotion to "The Hidden Jesus" in the Blessed Sacrament, as Francisco would describe the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle. He would run home from school each day to go to the church to spend time before the Tabernacle to 'console' Jesus who was often forgotten about or abandoned by people. He and his sister, Jacinta were canonised by Pope Francis in Fatima on 13th May 1917, the centenary of the first Apparition.

Ellen Organ (August 24, 1903 – February 2, 1908), known as **Little Nellie of Holy God**, was an Irish child, venerated by some in the Roman Catholic Church for her precocious spiritual awareness and alleged mystical life. Particularly dedicated to the Eucharist, the story of her life inspired Pope (St) Pius X to admit young children to Holy Communion. In 1910, Pope Pius X issued the decree "*Quam singulari*," which lowered the age of Holy Communion for children from 12 years to around 7.

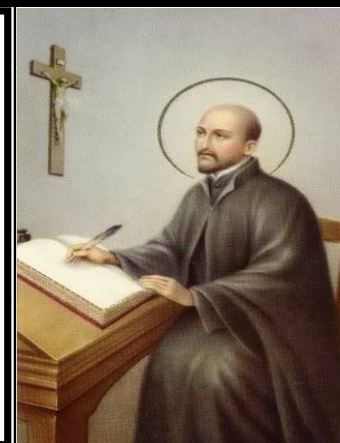
