Dear Brothers and Sisters,

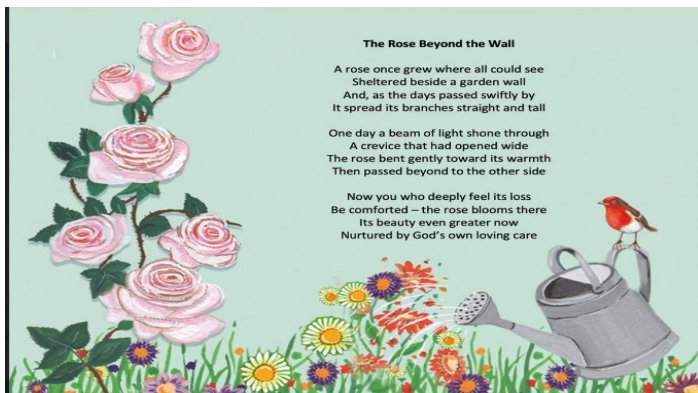

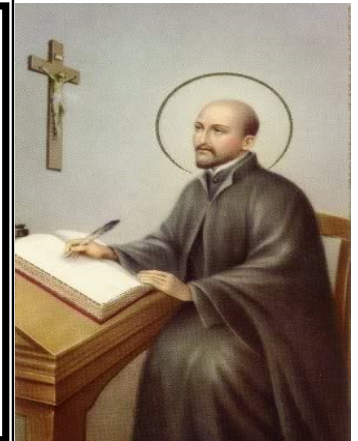

This will be a different Lent than before, as a result:

"The Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments asked priests to take special anti-COVID-19 precautions this year when distributing ashes on Ash Wednesday (February 17th) including sprinkling ashes on the top of people's heads rather than using them to make a cross on people's forehead."
